





Eric Carson's hobby is white-water rafting. He has gone rafting every summer for five years.


Eric likes rafting because it is exciting. He especially likes the rapids because they are fast. "The rapids are as fast as a roller coaster," he said.


Newburg School had its annual international festival last Saturday. Over 300 people enjoyed food and activities from all over the world.


Last week our class visited the farmers' market in Somerville. We learned about farming and tasted some delicious food. We also met Ed Martin, the owner of the farmers' market.


The market was very popular. After a few years it became too big for the barn, so they had to build a bigger building.
